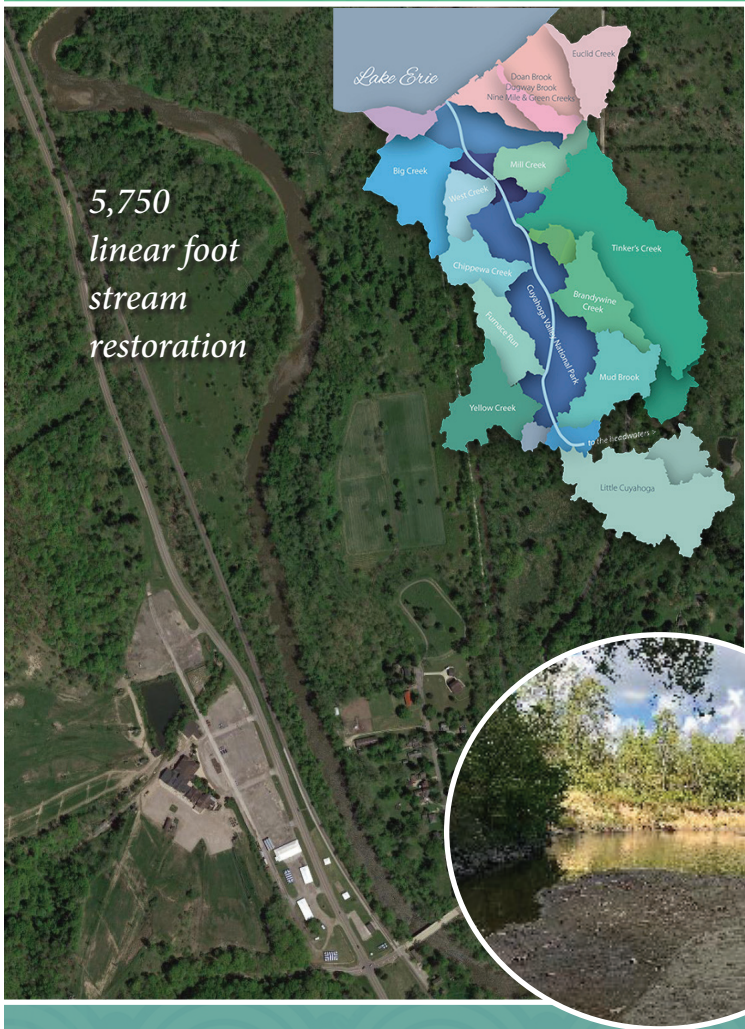

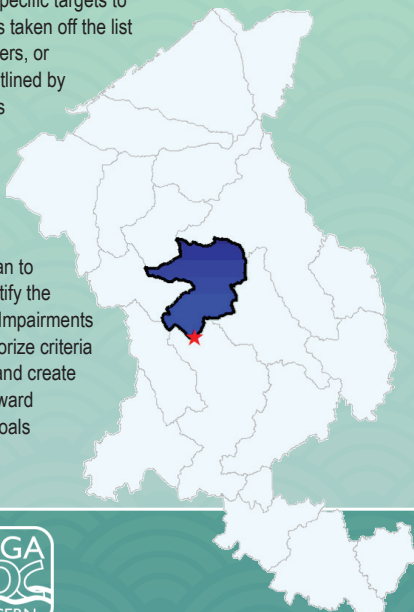

PROJECT OVERVIEW

This stretch of the Cuyahoga River is exhibiting issues of accelerated Channel Erosion, unstable platform, and limited stream habitat in low quality (silt cover, steep banks, and invasive species). The solution that has been identified is to lengthen the channel by creating more meanders and features to achieve a more stable equilibrium. This approach will modify the channel slope to address the increased flows as well as an inclusion of backwater wetland habitats to reduce the erosion exhibited.

The AOC has specific targets to meet before it is taken off the list of impaired waters, or "delisted" as outlined by the Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement (GLWQA). The Advisory Committee developed a plan to identify and rectify the Beneficial Use Impairments (BUIs) to categorize criteria for restoration and create benchmarks toward achieving the goals of delisting.
